REVISED LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE SETTLEMENTS: 2001-02 TO 2003-04

- 1. Following an announcement by Jack McConnell, Minister for Education, on 14 February, additional resources of £67.4m/£55.8m/£169.5m are being made available to local authorities to honour the Scottish Executive's commitment to fund the implications of McCrone in full. The additional resources will supplement the provision already made for McCrone in the local government settlement which was approved by the Scottish Parliament on 7 February.
- 2. A second Local Government Finance Order reflecting the additional money is being laid before the Scottish Parliament, and the money will be paid to councils as part of their weekly Revenue Support Grant payments once Parliamentary approval is given.
- 3. This Circular updates the information on AEF aggregate totals and distribution provided in Finance Circular 13/2000, and Christie Smith's subsequent letter of 19 January, and provides details of the revised Scottish Executive revenue allocations for each local authority for the next 3 years.
- 4. Revised Green Book pages, which were e-mailed to you on 23 March, are also attached for reference.
- 5. A separate copy of this circular has been sent by e-mail to your Director of Finance and to Norie Williamson at CoSLA.

EXPLANATORY NOTES TO AEF DISTRIBUTION

The calculations are set out in the table at Annex 3. Column numbers are consistent throughout the separate sections for mainland and islands authorities. Columns 1 to 8 relate to the distributions for 2001-02, 2002-03 and 2003-04. Columns 9 to 11 are relevant to 2001-02 only.

- 1. <u>Column 1</u> of the table is the estimated service expenditure of each authority. This column includes Special Islands Needs Allowance.
- 2. <u>Column 2</u> contains allocations of loan charge support. Capital from current revenue continues to be excluded. The figures were calculated as described in Annex 7.
- 3. <u>Column 3</u> contains an assessment of the expenditure on housing and council tax benefits of each authority, net of DSS subsidy. The figures provide for a proportion of 5.5% of housing and council tax benefit (0.5% relates to incentive area spending) to be met by authorities.
- 4. <u>Column 4</u> is the assessment of the floor adjustments for each authority. The figures were calculated as shown in Annex 5.
- 5. <u>Column 5</u> is the total of columns 1 to 4. That is, it is Total Estimated Expenditure (TEE).
- 6. Column 6 is the estimated number of Band D equivalent properties as at September 2000 on which council tax will be levied.
- 7. <u>Column 7</u> represents the portion of adjusted TEE which is <u>not</u> supported through AEF. This amount is distributed among authorities in proportion to their share of the national council tax base. This is achieved by a formula:

(Total adjusted TEE less total AEF) X <u>band D equivalent properties in authority</u> total band D equivalent properties

- 8. Column 8 is the difference between columns 5 and 7 being the total amount of AEF. The total of column 8 is AEF of £6,030.025m in 2001-02, (i.e. the total of £6,048.791, less undistributed Excellence Fund Special Programme and SEN specific grant, £31.874m, plus the amount of specific grant on police loan charges, £13.108m, which are supported by grant but are accounted for outside AEF). AEF for 2002-03 and 2003-04 is £6,325.671m and £6,676.245m respectively.
- 9. Column 9 shows the amount of specific grants (excluding Police CPS, but including Police specific grant loan charges) for 2001-02. A number of specific grants (e.g. police) are paid directly to joint boards. In these cases, for AEF distribution purposes only, the estimated amount for each force or brigade has been broken down on the same basis as is used for the relevant GAEs. Distribution to constituent council level of common police services and police specific grant loan charges as used in the calculation of Police Specific grant for 2001-02, has been based on advice from treasurers of the Police Boards.
- 10. <u>Column 10</u> shows the amount of Distributable NDRI. This has been distributed amongst authorities in proportion to 1999 mid-year population estimates.











11. Column 11 distributes RSG, being the remainder of AEF after deductions for Specific Grants and NDRI.

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- 5. In 2001-02, the transitional adjustments will start to be phased out with the aim that by 2004-05 all ratepayers will be paying their true rates bills. This year, therefore, transitional relief will be restricted to 75% in real terms of that awarded last year.
- 6. A supply of the leaflet "Non-Domestic Rates Transitional Arrangements: 2001-02" providing details of the transitional scheme for 2001-02 has been sent to all councils. It supplements the information provided in the Scottish Executive's pamphlet "Non-Domestic Rates Revaluation 2000 Transitional Arrangements". Both are available on the Scottish Executive's website on www.scotland.gov.uk under "Publications".
- 7. The Regulations also provide for a reduced poundage of 45.0p to apply to all properties falling within transitional relief with a rateable value of £10,000 or less. This is intended to provide a reduction in the rates payable by small businesses during 2001-02. Part IV of the Regulations gives effect to this provision for properties with a rateable value of £10,000 or less which fall outwith the transitional relief arrangements.
- 8. The Regulations also carry forward the existing provisions for the treatment of property which is formed as a result of splits, merger or reorganisation during the year 2001-02 and provisions in respect of changes in rateable values during the year.

THE VALUATION FOR RATING (PLANT AND MACHINERY)(SCOTLAND) **AMENDMENT REGULATIONS 2001** THE NON-DOMESTIC RATES (LEVYING)(SCOTLAND) REGULATIONS 2001

- 1. I am directed by Ministers to draw to your attention that the above Statutory Instruments have been made. They came into force on 1 April 2001 and have effect from that date.
- 2. The Valuation for Rating (Plant And Machinery)(Scotland) Amendment Regulations 2001 exempt from rating plant and machinery belonging to all combined heat and power (CHP) plants. The Regulations amend the Valuation for Rating (Plant and Machinery)(Scotland) Regulations 2000 which specify for Scotland the plant and machinery to be assumed from 1 April 2000 to be part of lands and heritages for the purposes of valuation for non-domestic rating.
- The Regulations implement a recommendation of the advisory Committee established in 1996 under the chairmanship of Derek Wood CBE, QC (the "2nd Wood Committee") to examine the treatment of plant and machinery in those industries subject to prescribed assessment, essentially the utilities which were, or are still in part, in public ownership. The Committee made a number of recommendations. Principal among these was the introduction of a "tools of the trade" exemption for electricity generation plant and machinery used in the power industry. It was also recommended that a similar exemption should be extended to plant and machinery belonging to all combined heat and power (CHP) plants. It is to this latter exemption that the Regulations give effect. The Regulations ensure the continued harmonisation of rating and valuation practice between England and Scotland.
- The Non-Domestic Rates (Levying) (Scotland) Regulations 2001 roll forward the policy behind the current Regulations. In the first year following Revaluation (2000-01) real increases and decreases in bills were limited to a set percentage. The real increase in bills of small businesses (those with a rateable value of £10,000 or less) was limited to 5% and for all other subjects the limit on increases was 7.5%. For all properties subject to transitional arrangements decreases were limited to 5% in the first year.
