

Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17

The Scottish Government is launching the Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17 as part of its efforts to support the organic sector in Scotland. The Fund is intended to develop Organic Ambitions, Scotland's Organic Action Plan 2016-2020.

Fund Outcomes

Our aim is to achieve a stronger Scottish organic sector, one that offers further public benefits to society whilst at the same time being better positioned to compete with the rest of the UK, Europe and internationally. The overarching outcome of the Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17 is to:

- Strengthen the Scottish organic supply chain (Organic Ambitions: Action 2.3)
- Develop and coordinate an existing delivery plan for Organic Ambitions 2016-2020

Fund Principles

In January 2016, the Cabinet Secretary for Rural Affairs Food and the Environment, Richard Lochhead MSP, launched Organic Ambitions, Scotland's Organic Action Plan 2016-2020. The action plan reflects our shared agenda for the sector, with actions to be taken forward by all parties concerned with growing the organic food and drink supply chain in Scotland.

To support the implementation of the Action Plan, the Scottish Government has been working with the Scottish Organic Forum to identify which areas of the action plan should be the focus of this Fund in 2016/17. The core element identified was:

- to strengthen the infrastructure throughout the Scottish organic supply chain: focusing on addressing the critical gaps in infrastructure, particularly organically certified abattoirs, grain mills and other processing facilities;
- to develop and coordinate the existing five year delivery plan

The Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17 has adopted these core elements as its overarching principle. Projects will be expected to demonstrate how they meet the principle as part of the application process.

The Fund

The Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17 will support one or more winning applications that:

1. Can develop existing relationships within the organic supply chain and can identify and address critical gaps

2. Can demonstrate a proven track record of successfully developing, coordinating and delivering projects

Project applications that demonstrate strong partnership working and seek to develop innovative approaches to strengthening the Scottish organic supply chain will be prioritised.

All projects will be expected to demonstrate a strong focus on evaluation to support the lessons learned process and the identification and promotion of best practice.

Eligibility

The Organic Ambitions Fund 2016/17 will support one or more applicants from any of the following:

- third sector organisations (voluntary organisation, charity or social enterprise)
- public or private sectors.

The winning project(s) must:

- Be able to start delivering by 18 July 2016.
- Finish activity by 30 April 2017, final evaluation by 31 May 2017.

Grant

The Fund value is £50,000. Projects can apply for funding up to £50,000.
