Dear Lord Bonomy,

I trust you to ensure that the spirit of the Protection of Wild Mammals (Scotland) Act 2002 is upheld and enforced with the killing of foxes and other mammals by packs of dogs being properly banned in Scotland.

2. Restrict the number of hounds which can be used to flush out foxes to a maximum of two
