1. Name the policy, and describe its overall aims.

Miners' strike 1984/85 pardon

A consultation on the qualifying criteria which are to apply to a collective pardon being granted to miners who were convicted of certain matters relating to the miners' strike of 1984/85.

2. What aspects of the policy/measure will affect children and young people up to the age of 18?

None. The policy affects ex-miners who are now aged 50+ years, with an indirect impact on police officers.
