The intention is to provide elected members who are
	involved in decision-making on planning applications a minimum level of understanding of the planning system and their role within that in order to help participate in the decision-making process in a fair and just manner.
Summary of evidence	There is clear evidence of socio-economic disadvantage and inequalities of outcome being linked to where people live and work. Many of these issues are complex and there are more targeted policy areas that will tackle them specifically. However, it is reasonable to assume that the planning system has a role in the way these inequalities impact on communities.
	Although mandatory training for elected members will not focus specifically on socio-economic disadvantage and inequalities, the implementation of mandatory training will ensure elected members across all local authorities will be provided the same minimum level of training and therefore will be able to make informed, robust planning decisions which will support the places where people live and work.
Summary of assessment findings	The planning system should support decisions that improve equality and help to eliminate discrimination, with a fairer, more inclusive and equalities based approach to planning in the future. Mandatory training will not hinder that approach and will help provide a minimum level of training to elected members so they can participate in the decision-making process in a fair and just manner.
