This declaration relates only to the modifications made by Ministers in approving the Aberdeen City and Shire Strategic Development Plan (ACSSDP). The Proposed ACSSDP was subject to EqIA (Equalities and Human Rights Impact Assessment) in February 2013, and found to have no negative impacts on any equality group.

No EqIA is being carried out for the modifications because the modifications have been screened for these purposes and found not to have relevance for equality groups.

In the main, the modifications to the plan, that Ministers are responsible for, represent clarifications or changes to accurately reflect Scottish Planning Policy and other strategic policies.

The most significant modifications relate to the Strategic Transport Fund. These modifications ensure that the references in the plan to the fund are in line with national policy. Specifically they clarify which projects identified in the plan will be delivered through the fund and from what types of development contributions to the fund will be sought. No new projects have been identified and no specific developments are identified, only types of development such as housing, business or retail. The modifications may therefore impact on the development industry in considering which developments to promote. It may be that the location and type of specific developments could have some equalities impacts, but these will be addressed through subsequent local development plans and through the planning application process. No equalities impacts arising out of the modifications to the Proposed Plan have therefore been identified.
