WHAT IS THE EMA AND WHAT IS THIS TOOLKIT?

THE SCOTTISH GOVERNMENT IS COMMITTED TO ENSURING THAT THE PROSPECTS OF OUR YOUNG PEOPLE ARE NOT HAMPERED BY THEIR BACKGROUND AND HOUSEHOLD INCOME.

That is why the Scottish Government has retained the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) in Scotland, a fund to support students aged between 16 and 19 to continue with their learning. Over 33,000 school and college students in Scotland receive the EMA, and last year the government extended the eligibility criteria so more young people can get financial support to help fulfil their potential.

Now, as students return for the 2016/17 year, we want to make sure as many eligible students as possible are aware of the programme and receive this help. This toolkit outlines a national awareness-raising campaign taking place during September 2016, with promotional materials being sent to every Scottish secondary school and college, and word being spread via social media channels.

The toolkit also explains how you can take part and help make sure students and their families are aware of the help they are entitled to in order to continue learning.

EMA AND WHAT WE'RE DOING

EDUCATION MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE IS A PAYMENT OF £30 PER WEEK TO YOUNG PEOPLE AGED 16 TO 19 YEARS OLD FROM LOW INCOME FAMILIES TO REMAIN IN POST 16 LEARNING.

The Scottish Government believes the EMA helps support young people to make decisions about their learning that are based on their ability and aspirations rather than their financial circumstances.

Currently over 33,000 school and college students in Scotland receive the EMA. The government has expanded the programme so that an anticipated 22,000 more young people could benefit from the allowance. To that end, the financial thresholds for families have been raised and part-time college courses have been included to ensure more students are eligible.

Students from a family earning up to £24,421 a year with one dependent child or up to £26,884 if they have siblings - could be eligible, depending on the course they're studying or if they are on an Activity Agreement as well as meeting the other eligibility criteria such as residency. The payment is based on attendance and on the student fulfilling any learning agreement they have.

In 2016, we're working in partnership with schools, colleges and others to raise awareness among students, guidance teachers and bursary offices, and families.

HOW YOU CAN HELP CAMPAIGN MATERIALS

EVERY SECONDARY SCHOOL AND COLLEGE IS RECEIVING POSTERS AND FLYERS TO DISPLAY AND DISTRIBUTE TO STUDENTS AND TEACHERS. THERE ARE THREE VERSIONS OF POSTERS FOR STUDENTS, FOR DISPLAY IN YOUR STUDENT-FACING AREAS SUCH AS NOTICE BOARDS, COMMON ROOMS AND HALLWAYS. THERE IS ALSO A VERSION FOR DISPLAY IN STAFF AREAS. ALL FOUR VERSIONS ARE PROVIDED IN BOTH A3 AND A4.

We have also sent you A5 two-sided flyers for students. We would appreciate it if you could distribute these to all students in the 16-19 age bracket, and in particular those you know to be eligible for the EMA. Please note that some students feel there is a slight stigma attached to receiving an EMA, so please be discrete and sensitive.

KEY MESSAGES FACTS AND STATS

THE EMA PROGRAMME WAS EXPANDED IN JANUARY 2016 TO SUPPORT MORE YOUNG PEOPLE. THE INCOME THRESHOLDS WERE RAISED AND PART-TIME NON-ADVANCED COLLEGE COURSES WERE INCLUDED.

Local authorities and colleges deliver the programme on behalf of the Scottish Government.

The weekly payment of £30 is based on 100% attendance and fulfilling the terms of learning agreements. Learning agreements give local authorities and colleges discretion to offer flexibility to some students based on their circumstances; for example, young carers.

In 2014/15 in Scotland 33,180 school pupils and college students received EMA payments, a decrease of 6% (2,290) from 2013-14

School pupils account for 68% of young people receiving an EMA, with college students making up the remaining 32%. In 2014/15, this translated to 22,530 school pupils and 10,650 college students.

YOUR INSTITUTION is encouraging students to make sure they're getting the financial support they're entitled to in order to stay in education.

Thousands of Scottish secondary school and college students receive the Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) each year, a Scottish Government fund to support young people from lower income families to continue their learning. Students aged 16 to 19 get £30 a week to help with their education, dependent on attendance and individual learning agreements.

Now, schools, colleges and local authorities across Scotland are working with the Scottish Government to ensure as many young people who entitled to the EMA as possible apply for the support.

YOUR SPOKESPERSON said:

"For all young people, education is crucial to improving their employment prospects and the quality of their lives. But many face financial barriers to continuing their learning and that's why we're acting to make sure they are aware of the support they're entitled to."

"The EMA has already helped thousands of young people in Scotland stay on in education to build up their skills and employability. The allowance is a lifeline to those students, contributing towards books, travel costs and other expenses."

Over 33,000 school and college students in Scotland receive the EMA. At the start of this year, the Scottish Government raised the income thresholds and also made some part-time college courses eligible. If a student's family earns up to £24,421 a year - or £26,884 if they have siblings - they could be eligible, depending on the course they're studying or if they are on an Activity Agreement.

TEMPLATE MEDIA RELEASE NOTES TO EDITORS

THE EMA PROVIDES AN INCENTIVE FOR STUDENTS AGED 16 TO 19 (UP TO THEIR 20TH BIRTHDAY) FROM LOW INCOME FAMILIES TO STAY IN EDUCATION, EITHER IN SCHOOL OR ON A COLLEGE COURSE.

The incentive is an entitlement and demand-led programme which is administered by local authorities and colleges on behalf of Scottish Ministers.

The weekly payment of £30 is based on 100% of agreed attendance and fulfilling the terms of learning agreements. Learning agreements give local authorities and colleges discretion to offer flexibility to some students based on their circumstances; for example, young carers.

NEXT STEPS

THIS SHORT BURST OF ACTIVITY IS THE FIRST STEP OF WIDER MARKETING TO RAISE AWARENESS OF THE EMA AND ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO RECEIVE THE HELP THEY ARE ENTITLED TO.

We intend carrying out research in the near future to help us better understand why some eligible students aren't applying for the EMA and how best to encourage them to do so. From there, we will consider whether further marketing activity is required and if so, what that would look like.

Timings are being finalised and we will soon come out to you to ask for your help.

You can get involved by helping us speak to students and also giving us your views on how the EMA system works, what are the barriers for students, and how we can encourage more students to apply. We also want to know how we can work with schools, colleges and local authorities to make the most of our marketing strategies.











