# Member Reappointed to the NHS Education for Scotland Board

The Cabinet Secretary for Health and Sport, Jeane Freeman MSP, today announced the reappointment of Anne Currie as a Member of the NHS Education for Scotland Board.

# MEMBER

**Anne Currie** has served as non-executive member of the NHS Education for Scotland Board since September 2018. She was a senior Prosecutor within the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service (COPFS), serving communities in Glasgow, Ayrshire and Grampian in the investigation of crime and the investigation of deaths. Her remit also covered Domestic Abuse, Sexual Offences, Youth Justice, Diversity and the Greener Agenda and Sustainability for the organisation. She engaged with stakeholders across Scotland to bring awareness and understanding of the role of COPFS to many communities. Anne was the first Chair of the National Confidential Forum. She has a commitment to education with long service as school governor and parent council representative and for four years was President of the Scottish Medico Legal Society, whose aim is to provide continuing education opportunities primarily to those in the legal and medical professions.

#### REAPPOINTMENT

This reappointment will be for four years and will run from 1<sup>st</sup> September 2021 to 31<sup>st</sup> August 2025.

This reappointment is regulated by the Ethical Standards Commissioner.

### REMUNERATION

This reappointment is part-time and attracts a remuneration of £8,842 per annum for a time commitment of one day per week.

### **OTHER MINISTERIAL APPOINTMENTS**

Ms Currie does not hold any other ministerial public appointments.

# POLITICAL ACTIVITY

All appointments are made on merit and political activity plays no part in the selection process. However, in accordance with the original Nolan recommendations, there is a requirement for appointees' political activity within the last five years (if there is any to be declared) to be made public.

Ms Currie has had no political activity within the last five years.
