Was delighted that you were able to visit Scotland last week. I am sorry that I was not able to meet you myself, following the result in the UK election the previous Thursday and I would like to thank you very much for your understanding. However, I was pleased that Keith Brown, Cabinet Secretary for the Economy, Jobs and Fair Work was able to meet and host the dinner for you at Edinburgh Castle on my behalf.

I asked the Cabinet Secretary to report to me directly on the progress of your visit, and was glad to hear of the productive discussion you had regarding our shared commitment to a prosperous, trusting and mutually beneficial relationship between Scotland and Guangdong.

I understand that you had some excellent discussions, not just over dinner but also during your visit to Edinburgh University the following day. I really hope that these will lead to greater collaboration, building upon existing partnerships in life sciences, renewable energy, finance and higher education – areas which are of key importance to Scotland.

Scotland and China have a long history of partnership. A recent notable investment saw Chinese tourism group Ctrip buy Edinburgh-based online search company Skyscanner for £1.4bn in November 2016. This investment will see the company grow its insights and technologies on a global scale.

And it's not just in investment that Scotland and China hold a strong relationship. I was delighted that some of the delegation could visit the Edinburgh Bio Quarter to witness Scotland's pioneering lead in the life sciences sector, a key component in our economic strategy. Scotlish biotechnology companies have an international reputation for tradition, innovation and quality. The Bio Quarter serves as an excellent example of what many Scotlish companies can offer China in co-development and partnership.









I firmly believe that the combination of Scotland's expertise and China's strong digital health and technology capabilities creates a strong foundation for future success and it is vitally important to continue developing further collaborations between us.

Scotland has a long reputation of academic excellence; most recently the University of Edinburgh healthcare team has developed strong relationships in Shenzhen with both the university and a leading public hospital. This has led to the project establishing a Shenzhen University/University of Edinburgh/Huaxia Healthcare Group medical research institute.

I understand that you enjoyed your visit to Edinburgh University on Monday 12 June, and particularly your time at the Centre of Robotics. I know that Professor Sethu Vijayakumar welcomed the opportunity to demonstrate their world leading research capabilities in Robotics. I also understand that there is tremendous innovation in this field in Guangdong, especially in the manufacturing sector.

I am therefore delighted that Edinburgh University are looking at a partnership in this field with Guangdong and that this could take the form of a joint research lab in robotics. I further understand that Professor Vijayakumar is planning to visit Guangdong in September 2017 to move this forward. I am very pleased that your visit has directly led to opportunities such as this to increase the collaboration between Guangdong and Scotland.

Finally, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you, party officials and investors who travelled to Scotland for your engagement on such a successful visit, and for sharing your insights with my officials during this time. I hope to get the opportunity to meet with you in the near future.
