### **RECALLED APPEAL – ENERGY RECOVERY FACILITY, SOUTH STREET, SCOTSTOUN, GLASGOW**

You will recollect that, in October 2016, Ministers recalled the above appeal for their determination because of the sensitivities of this particular type of development, the residential characteristics of the area and the significant level of public interest. Karen Black, the appointed reporter, subsequently provided her report, with recommendation, to PAD in January 2017.

Ministers wish to be assured that fully up to date information is made available to inform a decision. On that basis, the Minister requires further details of the proposed connection with end users for the thermal energy (heat) produced by the facility. The Minister notes that the Heat and Power Plan prepared in support of the application is over 2 years old (March 2015), and has asked that an up to date position and views are sought on the proposals and prospects of heat connection and distribution through the establishment of a new district heating network.

To enable the Minister to make a fully informed decision, further information should be sought, considered and reported on as appropriate, to include the following matters:

- The current position of discussions between the applicant and Glasgow City Council on the proposed district heating element of the proposal and connectivity to potential end users.
- The current position in relation to heat mapping in Glasgow.
- The current position of discussions between the applicant and SEPA on the proposal and the scope of the Pollution Prevention and Control (PPC) permit application.
- The updated views of SEPA on the Heat and Power Plan/Updated Heat and Power Plan with regard to energy recovery (heat) proposals.

I would be grateful if you could give an indication of the reporter's availability to take this request forward.
