Thank you for your email and apologies for missing your call this morning. I'm afraid I will not be able to join a call to discuss this matter today.

As set out in my original letter, this consultation on the FOi is a courtesy, not a statutory obligation, and Teach First do not have a veto on disclosure of the information. Under the terms of the FOISA, the decision on whether or not to release information is for the Scottish Government alone. We will however take account of your views, so if you can provide information on the specific items/aspects causing concerns, we will consider these.

My role as a reviewer of this case is to consider the information held carefully, and to assess whether an exemption under FOISA applies to that information, and if applicable, the public interest in disclosure is outweighed by the public interest in upholding the exemption.
