Bursaries

- 13. In England the Department for Education, through the National College for Teaching and Leadership, provide bursaries as financial incentives to attract and retain high quality graduates into teaching. Bursary levels in England vary between £4,000 and £30,000 according to the trainee's degree classification and the subject in which they wish to train to teach. For example the level of bursary for Physics graduates with a 1st class degree or a PhD is £30,000, and for a 2:2 degree in Biology it is £10,000. The subjects eligible for bursaries and the level of bursary for each subject is reviewed each year according to need. Full details are provided in Annex B.
- 14. ITE students in Scotland already receive significant support from the Scottish Government through paid tuition fees and a guarantee of one year paid employment of £22k during their induction year, neither of which are provided in England.

REDACTED While DfE's own analysis on the impact of bursaries since £20,000 bursaries were introduced in 2012-13 (the year that £9,000 tuition fees were also introduced) found a 3.7% increase in applications for each £1,000 increase made to bursaries, and a corresponding decrease for each £1,000 reduction, REDACTED
- 16. REDACTED The National Audit Office in a report to the House of Commons Education Committee in June last year were critical of the fact that the effectiveness of bursaries had not been properly evaluated, despite almost £1 billion being spent on them.
