Malady of Death Bouffes du Nord Thu 16 – Sun 19 Aug

Katie Mitchell will direct an adaptation of Marguerite Duras' 1982 novella. The production will be performed in English. Casting at Bouffes includes Irene Jacob and Laetitia Dosch – we cannot confirm Edinburgh casting as yet. The novella tells the story of a man who pays a woman to spend several weeks with him by the sea and to teach him how to love. There are two characters known as 'she' and 'you' and a third, a narrator – this structure provokes a tension in the text, and Mitchell describes the tone as "secretive and strange, resembling a psychological thriller". The text explores themes of gender, intimacy, love. Katie Mitchell is a prominent British theatre director who is a significant voice in contemporary theatre and has worked across Europe.

Musical conception and supervision will be undertaken by William Christie – founder of Les Arts Florissants. The ensemble will comprise of 14 singer-actors and 9 musicians from Les Arts Florissants. Gay's 1728 satire is set amongst

London's thieves, pimps and prostitutes and brought together a mix of classical and pop music of the time. The Beggar's Opera most notably inspired Kurt Weil and Bertolt Brecht's Threepenny Opera.

In his summary of the 1947 Festival, the journalist Lionel Birch wrote, "At least for the duration of the Festival, the ungenerosity which has disfigured post-war Britain was wiped away. In its place was the fresh spirit – the Festival spirit, or the Christian spirit, or the divine spirit, or the human spirit, or whatever you like to call it. People treating all other people with consideration, and indeed (I have to say it) with love."

Four years later in 1951 a twenty five year old director presented a production of Shakespeare's A Winter's Tale a the Lyceum Theatre with John Guilgud – the director was Peter Brook and now 67 years later he returns to the same theatre for the first time since then to lead this season from that the Bouffes du Nord – a season that represents the points of connection between many different cultures. The Prisoner with a company from Sri Lanka, Rwanda, France and the UK in a tale from Afghanistan; Maladie de La Mort, Katie Mitchell;s reframing of Marguirete Duras' harrowing novel and The Beggar's Opera in a new version by Robert Carsen and William Christie bringing an international cast of music theatre performers alongside musicians from Les Arts Florisants.

Beyond the historic visit of the Bouffes, we have a particularly strong French programme this year – Theatre de Champs Elysses bring Laurent Pelly's production of 'The Barber of Seville' with Jeramie Rhore conduction his ensemble Le Cercle d'Harmonie and Opera de Lyon will present Stefan Herheim's production of La Cenerentola.
