Under children and families, the SNP committed to the following in their manifesto:

We will refresh our internet safety action plan, linking it to our strategy on digital participation, so that appropriate frameworks of training, support and information are in place for professionals and families, including children and young people

We are therefore currently working across government to update our internet safety action plan, ensuring it is linked to our Digital Participation strategy. We are also taking steps to ensure the refreshed action plan is linked to work being taken forward in schools. In addition to this, we will be engaging with key external stakeholders who will be crucial in the development of a refreshed action plan. The plan will be published by March 2017.
